

## Genuine Leather Care & Cleaning

### Spot Cleaning

Occasional dusting with a clean, dry cloth or light vacuuming should be all that is necessary for regular cleaning and maintenance for your leather upholstery. In the case of a spill or stain, wipe excess liquid or dirt immediately with a clean, absorbent cloth or sponge and let air dry. Take note that the cleaning can be done with a damp cloth, but it should not soak the leather.

To keep your leather upholstery in the best condition, avoid letting buckles, studs and zippers come into direct contact with the leather. Do not apply saddle soap, oils, wax polishes or spray polishes as these are not made specifically for use on upholstery leather and could actually harm the leather. Avoid drying out the leather, take extra care when used near direct sunlight, heat sources or fireplaces.
